**WHEREAS**, through head-shaving events, partnerships, and advocacy initiatives, the primary focus of the St. Baldrick's Foundation is to have the greatest impact for kids with cancer around the world; and

WHEREAS, as only four percent of federal cancer funding goes directly to childhood cancer research; and

**WHEREAS,** St. Baldrick's Foundation is the largest funder of childhood cancer research grants outside of the United States government; and

**WHEREAS**, shaving heads is a visible demonstration of solidarity with those who have lost their hair to cancer treatment; and

**WHEREAS**, a "Defy Childhood Cancer" fundraising event for St. Baldrick's is being held at Mountain View High School on Friday, March 4, 2022 from 5:30 – 9:00 p.m.
